

THE ROLE OF THE "LOCAL CHURCH" CAMP & RETREAT ADVOCATE IS TO:

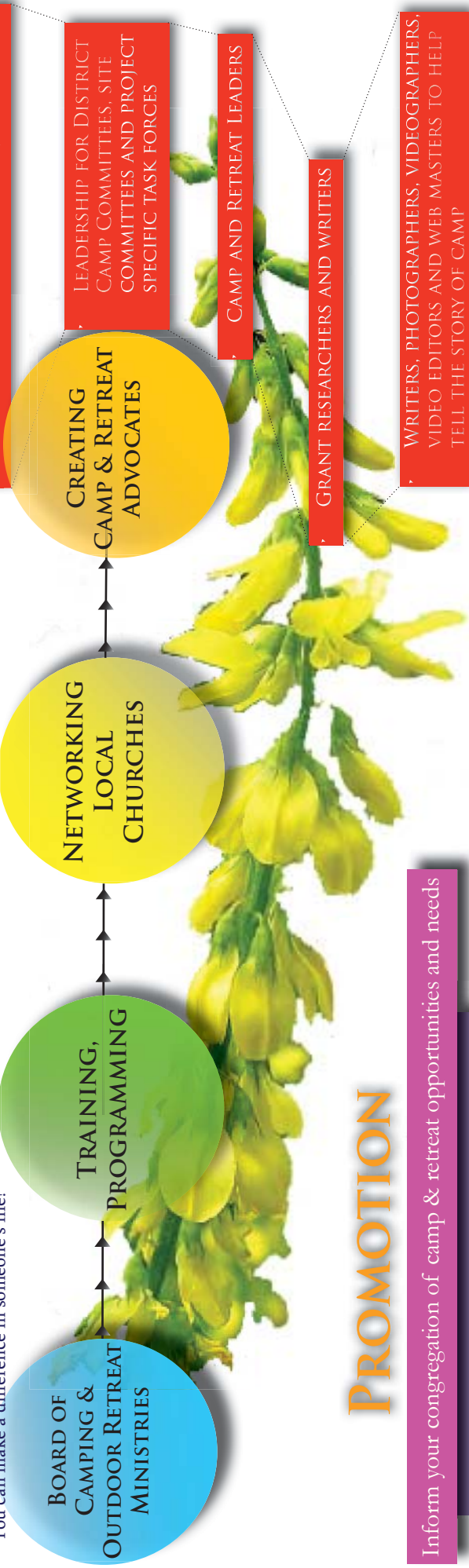
- 1) PROMOTE CAMP AND RETREAT MINISTRY OPPORTUNITIES

IDENTIFYING RESOURCES
