Dear Friend of Camp Wrightwood,

This is your invitation to “change lives” through service on the *Camp Wrightwood Site Committee*.

The principal duties of the *Site Committee* are 1) to promote the campsite and 2) to implement the comprehensive master site plan. This includes the development of financial resources to grow program, maintain the camp site, and expand the ministry through the implementation of the master site plan.

The *Site Committee* is made up of two task forces. The “Publicity” Task Force focuses on the promotion of the campsite and the cultivation of leadership. The “Development” Task Force identifies and develops the financial and human resources needed to expand the program, maintain the campsite and implement the comprehensive master site plan.

The *Site Committee* is accountable to the *Board of Camping, Outdoor, and Retreat Ministries* and meets bi monthly. Individual task forces and specialized sub groups may meet between meetings to complete their respective tasks

The *Site Committee* has the formidable challenge of renovating and building new facilities which will better meet the needs of your congregation and the community you serve. We need “support from” and “connection with” your congregation.

“Publicity” Task Force

Promote the campsite, programs offered at the site, and identify leadership

- Recruit and train “Local Church” Camp & Retreat Advocates
- Produce publicity and promotion of the campsites
- Recruit participants for appropriate District and Conference sponsored camp/retreat events held at the campsites
- Identify leadership for District & Conference Camps, Site Committee, and Board of Camping, Outdoor, and Retreat Ministries
- Coordinate site events



“Development” Task Force

Identify financial and human resources for the maintenance and development of the campsite

- Implement the BCORM approved Comprehensive Master Site Plan
- Cultivate unrestricted gifts (annual fund) for the campsite and the general camp and retreat ministry.
- Raise capital funds for the implementation of the BCORM approved Comprehensive Master Site Plan
- Cultivate gifts for trust funds (endowment) associated with the campsite and the general camping and retreat ministry.
- Identify and prioritize capital projects and major maintenance needs of the campsite
- Coordinate volunteer maintenance projects
